

## PE & Sport Premium Funding 2019-2020

### LITLEDOWN SCHOOL

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, to give them the opportunity to develop a healthy lifestyle, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

The funding is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is allocated to primary school head teachers. It is allocated for pupils in years 1-6 and for schools with 16 or less pupils it is allocated as £500 per eligible pupil and those with 17 or more pupils it is allocated based on a lump sum of £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per eligible pupil.

Schools must publish details of how they spend this funding and the effect it has had on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment. Ofsted report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.

#### Purpose of the Grant

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, funding can be used to:

- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve less active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers.

Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Raised self-esteem of pupils entering competitions -measured by improved behavior incidents across the year for those pupils competing
Strong links with local schools through Slough Sports Network– Sports Festivals and Tournaments, increased use of social media and newsletters to celebrate
Improved teaching as a result of resources and training- 90% or more of lesson observations good/outstanding
Improved links with community sporting facilities
Strong links with families through the Family FUNS programme
Improved behavior in school from all pupils- measured by % of pupils attending reward visits in autumn term compared to summer term.
Improved health of pupils- reduction in numbers of overweight pupils summer terms in consecutive years
Improved sporting ability –Gain at least silver in schools games marker
Gaining expertise from a qualified coach, have learnt new skills properly and been enthused by the way it's delivered.

Impact made in 2018/19 – How did it make a difference to the PE and sport participation and attainment of the pupils who attract the funding?
Raised self-esteem of pupils entering competitions – 85% of pupils entering competitions had less behavior incidents by the end of the year
Strong links with local schools through Slough Sports Network– Sports Festivals and Tournaments increased links with schools all on social media and newsletters
Improved teaching - 90% lesson observations in 18-19 were good/outstanding. Staff understanding of create development assessments well developed.
Improved pupils PE assessments results - 95% of pupils had improved scores in PE assessments.
Increase in parental engagement – 9 families attended Family FUNS and 1 parent attended netball club, overall this is the same level of parental engagement.
Improved behavior in school from all pupils- 53% of pupils attended more than 85% of reward visits summer term 2019 compared to 38% Autumn term 2018
Improved health of pupils- numbers of overweight pupils reduced by 2.5% in 18-19, from 20% in 2018 down to 17.5% in 2019
Improved sporting ability –The silver school games mark was achieved in September 2019.
Gaining expertise from a qualified coach - Students have learnt new skills and have been enthused by the way it's delivered.
