

# PE & Sport Premium Funding 2025-2026

## LITTLEDOWN SCHOOL

The PE and Sport premium funding is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, to give them the opportunity to develop a healthy lifestyle, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

The funding is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is allocated to primary school head teachers. It is allocated for pupils in years 1-6 and for schools with 16 or less pupils it is allocated as £500 per eligible pupil and those with 17 or more pupils it is allocated based on a lump sum of £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per eligible pupil.

Schools must publish details of how they spend this funding and the effect it has had on pupils’ PE and sport participation and attainment. Ofsted report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.

### Purpose of the Grant

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, funding can be used to:

- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve less active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils’ participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers.

Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
